that all my just debts and funeral and funerary expenses and the expenses of printing this  
my will be paid and satisfied by my trustees and executors hereinafter named and that a  
my said trustees to give full notice respecting my funeral and pay that same accordingly  
according to the usages and custom I may have for that purpose and that said trustees shall  
immediately limit and appoint all and singular my customary or copyhold or freehold lands  
Closely Lands Socreys and Premises situate lying and being within the County of Devon  
abovesaid and being parts and parcels of the respective manors of Shapland and other Socreys in  
Ditchbury in the Parish of Bremerton Devonshire otherwise Ditchbury in Colcombe into which  
Socrey of Ditchbury aforesaid boundaries to be into said lands and the aforesaid according to the  
Customs of the said respective manors under the said Soke and manor of Ditchbury  
accustomed to the Lord or Bore of the said respective manors for the payment of the sum to be  
and disposed of all and singular the said Socreys and Premises by public auction or private con-  
tract as in the bination as may think fit and make over my Socreys or Premises thereby  
and give receipt for the purchase money to such purchaser or purchasers and generally to retain  
all such acts as may be necessary and convenient for completing the said sale or sales and  
first that the receipt or receipts of my said Socreys and premises under the said Socreys or Premises  
lands shall be given him to have a good and sufficient and sufficient satisfaction and acquittance  
to said purchaser or purchasers respectively for the value of the purchase money for which such  
receipt or receipts shall be given and that after such receipt or receipts shall be given he or she  
or they or any of them or any of them as aforesaid shall be absolutely discharged from the same and  
shall not be obliged to look to or be in any way accountable or liable to account for the same  
application unto application or conveyance of such purchase money or any part thereof  
and I further direct that my property most immediately be sold if possible together with  
in out lot <sup>the sum of £1000</sup> that is to say the house where I now live in and the two dwellings wherein I bought  
of <sup>the sum of £1000</sup> all the orchard lands I bought of <sup>the sum of £1000</sup> Cliff of Overstock <sup>the sum of £1000</sup>  
being already sold the fields which I bought of Tolly Whetham my Deed and my two  
Carriage houses Wringham and Stable together with any horses or Building or  
dwelling house or land or build at the corner of Stacys or upon any part of such my  
property before mentioned also to give unto the said Richard Shribble all such money  
as may be due unto me upon any bond or scrip or whatsoever and whatsoever of the  
kind of my forecast and all my household goods and furniture and implements of household  
plate linen book etc and all and every my property of every sort and kind whatsoever and a  
whatsoever for all my estate and interest herein <sup>except my writing apparel my gold watch</sup>  
and certain articles of China <sup>except my writing apparel my gold watch</sup> and my Will is and shall be  
absent and unpoor him the said Richard Shribble immediately to call in and to  
receive all such money as may be due to me as aforesaid and to sell and dispose of  
all my household goods and furniture and implements of household and all other my  
property of every sort and kind except my gold watch and other articles <sup>not mentioned</sup> as soon as conveniently may be after my forecast and out of the monies arising thereupon as  
well as out of the monies arising from the sale of my said Copyhold Ditchbury lands and  
Premises my Will is and shall be clearly directed as follows in the first place to retain and pay  
unto himself the sum of forty pounds yearly <sup>for his services in executing this</sup> to the said Richard Shribble  
for his own absolute use and benefit as a small recompensation for  
his trouble in converting to writing this my Will and in the next place

to pay unto the Parishes of Bony Dourilot of Brisipot in the County of Dorset twenty thousand of  
 three hundred pounds to remain in his possession at Brisipot at five pounds per annum per cent  
 annuite upon his debt of lands and the interest thereof amounting to fifteen pounds per annum  
 & first to be paid to my wife Polly the wife of John Dourilot of Brisipot aforesaid District  
 for her life for her own sole and separate use by equal quarterly payments provided notwithstanding  
 my will is and I do hereby order and direct that as I was an elder for the sum of twenty first or  
 pounds and obliged to pay the same for or on account of the said John Dourilot the husband  
 of the said Polly Dourilot the said interest or annuity of fifteen pounds per annum shall abut  
 and not be paid unto the said Polly Dourilot for the space of five years from the time of my death  
 unless the said John Dourilot or some other person or persons on his behalf shall in the mean  
 time repay unto my said Estate that said sum of twenty first pounds but that the said interest  
 or annuity of fifteen pounds shall for the space of five years be paid into the hands of my said trustees  
 Stephen Wootton of Brisipot aforesaid and remain in his hands until Anna Dourilot the  
 daughter of the said John and Polly Dourilot shall attain the age of twenty one years or be  
 married upon either of which events happening the same is to be paid by the said Stephen or  
 Wootton unto the said Anna Dourilot it being my will that the said Polly Dourilot shall  
 not receive any part of the said Interest or annuity of fifteen pounds until the full amount of  
 the said sum of twenty first pounds has been repaid to my Estate and from and after the death  
 of the said Polly Dourilot then I will and direct that as my said Estate shall then be and a  
 account payment of the said principal sum of three hundred pounds from the said Anna Dourilot  
 and shall pay and divide the same as follows vizt unto the said Anna Dourilot the sum  
 of one hundred and fifty pounds unto Ebeneeze Dourilot son of the said John Dourilot the  
 sum of fifty pounds and unto John Dourilot the younger son of the said John Dourilot  
 the elder the remaining sum of one hundred pounds I give and bequeath the following sumis

 Dourilot the sum of ninety six pounds unto Nathaniel Dourilot another son of the said John  
 Dourilot the younger the sum of forty pounds unto Mary Scibble Daughter of the said Richard  
 Scibble the sum of five pounds unto William Warr son of George Warr deceased who formerly a  
 kept the Great Inn at Brisipot the sum of five pounds unto my stepson the said Stephen Wootton  
 the sum of five pounds unto Charles Wootton son of the said Stephen Wootton the sum  
 of five pounds unto David Proctor of Moleplaice that sum of five pounds and unto William  
 Hout son of Hout the sum of one pound all which said last mentioned legacies I direct to  
 be respectively paid as soon as conveniently may be after the settling in and out of my property a  
 before mentioned also I give unto old Charwel Hall of Distaffbury aforesaid three pounds worth  
 which I direct to be paid to her by my said trustees weekly and every week during her life also it is  
 my will that the sum of fifty five pounds be placed in the hands of the said Stephen Wootton  
 or Ebeneeze Dourilot at four and a half per cent interest and that out of the same  
 the sum of ten pounds be paid annually unto the said Ebeneeze Dourilot for the space of five years  
 and the sum of five pounds to the Granddaughter of Susanna Dorell of Molebury aforesaid  
 Daughter of James Molebury upon her attaining the age of twenty one years also I give unto  
 my said Polly Dourilot and to the said Anna the daughter all my vestures &c  
 apparel & equally divided between them unto the said Anna Dourilot I give my Gold watch  
 also all my Chain Tea and Dinner Plates except one perfect set of tea Cains which is to be  
 sold and it is my will that the Gold watch be never sold but always remain in the family  
 and I direct my said Trustees to invest in the Government Stocks or funds the sum of two  
 hundred pounds the dividends interest I give and direct to be paid as follows out monthly  
 annually to the officiating Minister for the time being of Weymouth Chapel within the parish  
 of Distaffbury aforesaid and the other yearly rates of annually to the officiating Minister for  
 the time being of the Chapel called Dr. Roberts' Chapel within the parish of Distaffbury aforesaid  
 I direct that account of the said donations may be painted in legible English on  
 Characters with black letters on a white ground on the front gallery of each Chapel as soon  
 as conveniently may be after my interment and request that the same account may be  
 continued in good preservation in care of the said Chapels provided also and my will further  
 is that in case the said John Dourilot the elder or any person or persons claiming or holding  
 through him or his assigns shall dispute or attempt to dispute respecting the Boundary or the  
 Grounds where I have now my dwelling that I built and were first in while said Grounds

I have in my will left from the estate in the West Bank to Anna Dourilots £5000 in the sum and  
 straight before the said Bank half a year before her death in the sum of  
 £1000 that I planted against the said Bank after the death of the said Anna Dourilots  
 interest or annuity of £1000 pounds unto the said Anna Dourilots for ever life and to her next  
 immediately after her death or default to distribute as aforesaid the sum of £1000 pounds  
 a annuity to the said Anna Dourilots shall absolutely stand and determine all the rest  
**Residuum and Residuum of my Estate and Effects** which may be left  
 of/after the several payments aforesaid I hereby give unto the said Anna Dourilots for ever now  
 sole and absolute not and benefit and to her my said Trustee to pay and transfer the same  
 to her absolutely and I make and appoint her said Richard Scibbles sole executor  
 of this my Will in Trust for all purposes aforesaid hereby revoking all former Wills annuities  
 and nominations by me at any time aforesaid made and bearing this and no other to be a  
 my last Will and Testament and I will and trust that my said Trustee his Executors and Administrators  
 shall and may pay return to and account annually and thencefore all sums unto myself as a  
 damages and expenses as to attorney shall as may be but unto me or about the execution of the  
 terms of this my Will and that he and they shall not be answerable or accountable for any more  
 money than shall actually come due or shall be due or for any less or losses which might  
 happen to the said sum money or estate except that same shall happen through his or their own

 shall moreover be let its full value to me <sup>and</sup> hereby doth also direct Anna Dourilots of my said Will

 the said legacies before he shall pay any interest or dividend as well the sum of one hundred pounds or  
 the dividends thereof in my said Will by me bequeathed to the officiating Minister for the time  
 being of Wootton Clap or any part thereof as the said sum of one hundred pounds or the  
 dividends or interest thereof by this my said Will bequeathed to be applied in the purchase of  
 Bread as aforesaid or any part thereof in witness whereof I the said Mary Sergeant have set  
 unto and signed this eight day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty four
